Admission to undergraduate (Bachelor level) classes	Student must have completed a minimum of one to two years of studies before starting their exchange semester at HTW Berlin, depending on the programme.
Admission to graduate (Master level) classes	Students must have completed the Bachelor's programme relevant to the academic field.
Admission to Design classes	In addition to the standard application documents, students applying for a Design study program, must submit a portfolio covering recent relevant works and a motivational letter.
	Students applying for the Horizon study programme " <i>Sustainable Clothing/Apparel Technology</i> (Bachelor)" must have studied in an engineering program for a minimum of 4 semesters prior to coming to HTW Berlin.

Level of German language required for admission to courses taught in German	B2 (upper intermediate)
Level of English language required for admission to courses taught in English	International Business: C1 All other programs taught in English: B2
Proof of language proficiency	The sending institution is responsible for ensuring the required language level from the institutions HTW Berlin accepts . Insurances	
All students...	... must register with a public German health insurance company and have them sent their insurance status (M10) electronically to HTW Berlin. This applies to non-EU as well as EU students. ... are recommended to sign up for personal liability insurance and travel insurance.
Immigration / Residents' Registration	
All students...	... must have a valid ID card and/or passport for the entire duration of their stay. ... must register at the Citizens' Office within 14 days of arrival.
Non-EU students...	... must register at Municipal Immigration Office.

Credits and Academic Degrees	
Credit point system used at HTW Berlin	ECTS – European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System
1 ECTS point corresponds to...	... 27 to 30 working hours in or outside of the classroom.
One academic year (consisting of two semesters) corresponds to 60 ECTS points.
Bachelor's degree programs at HTW Berlin usually cover...	... 210 ECTS points.
Master's degree programs at HTW Berlin cover...	... 90 additional ECTS points (leading to 300 points in total).
